# Delivering the Forward Plan

Our programme directly and indirectly supports the delivery of The National NHS Objectives for 2023/24 detailed in the 2023/24 priorities and operational planning guidance, the NHS Forward view, NHS West Yorkshire ICB Five Year Strategy and 10 big ambitions.

We will support inclusive system recovery; NHS Long Term Plan delivery and we will contribute towards future NHS transformation, through working in and across the system on major public health challenges, including;

- ICB mission to understand and reduce health inequalities, supporting actions to mitigate the impact of deprivation, cost of living / poverty crisis.
- Delivering prevention at scale, targeted prevention and supporting the delivery of the long-term plan. Embedding a culture of prevention to ensure West Yorkshire is trauma informed and responsive, and preventing suicide is everyone's business.
- Meeting our responsibility to lead on climate change, establishing the connection between good housing and good health and embedding a public health approach to reducing violent crime.

# Increasing system capability


